Vsebina:

1. Uvod v antropološko lingvistiko:
 - antropološka lingvistika kot interdisciplinarna veda;
 - jezikoslovna raziskovalna izhodišča: povezave z metodami sociolingvistike, psiholingvistike, etnolingvistike, kognitivnega jezikoslovja, pragmatike, analize diskurza in konverzacijske analize;
 - glavne smeri raziskav.
2. Raziskave jezikovnih praks:
 - jezikovne prakse in družbene skupnosti: jezikovna/govorna skupnost, izkustvena skupnost, družbene mreže;
 - status jezikovnih različkov: prestižnost – stigmatiziranost; standardni (pisni jezik – knjižni jezik – standard) in nestandardni jezikovni različki (dialekt, sociolekt, etnolekt); funkcijska razslojenost jezika, javno in zasebno

Content (Syllabus outline):

1. Introduction to Anthropological Linguistics:
 - Anthropological linguistics as an interdisciplinary science;
 - Starting points of linguistic research: links with the methods of sociolinguistics, psycholinguistics, ethno-linguistics, cognitive linguistics, pragmatics, discourse analysis and conversational analysis;
 - Main directions of the research.
2. Research into linguistic practices:
 - Linguistic practices and social communities: language/speech community, community of practice, social networks;
 - The status of language varieties: prestige vs. stigmatisation; standard (written language – literary language – standard language) vs. nonstandard varieties (dialect, sociolect, ethnolect); functional

- večjezičnost in večkulturnost: večjezičnost posameznika in skupnosti, jeziki v stiku, diglosija, jezikovna interferenca, kodni preklon, izposoja; globalizacija sporazumevalnih praks, pešanje in umiranje jezikov;
- jezikovne ideologije: jezik in nacionalizem, jezik in družbena/kulturna neenakost, jezikovna ideologija in jezikovno načrtovanje – jezikovna kultura, purizem, lingvicizem.

3. Metodologija antropološkolingvističnih raziskav in pojavne oblike jezika:

- raziskovalec kot soudeleženec: vpliv jezikovne in sporazumevalne zmožnosti raziskovalca na potek in rezultate antropološkolingvističnih raziskav;
- raziskave govornega jezika: tehnike opazovanja govora; formalni, neformalni, spontani govor; zapisovanje (izbor transkripcijskih načel) in analiza govora, interpretacija zunajjezikovnih prvin;
- raziskave pisanih besedil: pismenost in pisnost, pisne prakse, besedilni vzorci (dokumenti, zasebna korespondenca);
- med ustnim in pisnim – analiza elektronskih besedil, pisano besedilo kot pogovor.
- dokumentacijsko jezikoslovje kot metoda ohranjanja in revitalizacije ogroženih jezikov

4. Metode besedilne analize:

- analiza diskurza: opazovanje diskurzivnih praks, tehnika analize; kritična analiza diskurza (KAD); jezik in moč/politika/rasa/etnijska/razred/spol;
- konverzacijska analiza: dialog kot osnovna oblika človekove govorne dejavnosti; struktura dialoga; teorija vljudnosti;
- delo z jezikovnimi korpusi: korpusi kot vir antropološkolingvističnih raziskav.

differentiation of language, public and private communication; minority, local, national and world languages; language of individuals, idiolekt, the mental dictionary; artificial languages;

- Multilingualism and multiculturalism: individual and community multilingualism, languages in contact, diglossia, linguistic interference, code-switching, borrowing; globalisation of communicative practices, language decline and language death;
- Linguistic ideologies: language and nationalism, language, and social/cultural disparity, language ideology and language planning – language culture, purism, linguisticism.

3. Methodology of anthropological linguistic research and manifestation of language forms:

- Researcher as a participant: the impact of language and communicative competence of the researcher at the course and the results of the anthropological linguistic research;
- Research into the spoken language: observation techniques; formal, informal, spontaneous speech; recording (selection of transcription principles) and analysis of speech, interpretation of extra-linguistic elements;
- Research into written texts: literacy, written practices, textual patterns (documents, private correspondence);
- Between the oral and the written – analysis of electronic texts, written text as a conversation.
- Language documentation as a method of language maintenance and revitalisation

4. Methods of textual analysis:

- Discourse analysis: observation of discursive practices, analysing techniques; critical discourse analysis (CDA); language and power/politics/race/ethnicity/class/gender;
- Conversation analysis: dialogue as a basic form of human speech activity; structure

- varstvo osebnih podatkov – posameznik v skupnosti;
- pozitivni in negativni vplivi raziskovalnih postopkov na raziskovano skupnost.

Cilji in kompetence:

Metodološki okvir raziskav v antropološki lingvistiki je razumljen kot dinamično

Objectives and competences:

In anthropological linguistics the methodological research framework is understood as a dynamic

povezovanje (jezikoslovnih) raziskovalnih postopkov in orodij, ki z razčlenbo strukture in rabe jezika omogočajo uvid v njegov družbeni in kulturni kontekst ter razkrivajo njegovo vlogo pri vzpostavljanju, ohranjanju in preoblikovanju družbenih razmerij v skupnosti. Predmet je zato najprej namenjen predstavitvi širokega izbora posameznih metodoloških pristopov ter možnosti za njihovo uporabo in povezovanje na posameznih področjih antropološke lingvistike. V skladu s konkretnimi potrebami študentov in študentk podrobno obravnava posamezne raziskovalne tehnike in postopke ter jih pospremi z zgledi ustreznih in manj ustreznih praks pri analizi različnega jezikovnega gradiva.

integration of (linguistic) research methods and tools. These methods and tools enable an analysis of the structure and use of language to allow insight into its social and cultural context, as well as revealing its role in setting up, maintaining and transforming social relationships within the community. This course therefore aims to present a wide selection of single methodological approaches and the opportunities for their use and integration into specific areas of anthropological linguistics. In accordance with the specific needs of the students, it presents individual research techniques and procedures, along with their appropriate or inappropriate applications on analysis of different language material.

Predvideni študijski rezultati:

Študentke in študenti (1) razumejo pomen jezikoslovnih analiz za antropološke raziskave, (2) znajo izbrati najprimernejši metodološki pristop za lastno študijo primera in (3) uporabiti ustrezne tehnike zbiranja in analize jezikovnih podatkov.

Intended learning outcomes:

Students (1) understand the role of linguistic analysis in anthropological research, (2) are capable of choosing an appropriate research methodology for their own case study and (3) are able to apply the chosen techniques of language data collection and analysis.
